Resolution TA/ 14-38

Title: Funding Support for Tribal Tourism Development and Technical Assistance

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Central Council) is a federally recognized tribe with more than 29,000 tribal citizens; and

WHEREAS, invoking the divine blessing of the Creator upon our efforts and purposes, in order to preserve for ourselves and our descendents the inherent sovereign rights of our Native Alaskan corporations and Indian nations, rights secured under Indian treaties and agreements with the United States, and all other rights and the public toward a better understanding of Native Alaskan and Indian people, to preserve Indian cultural values, and otherwise promote the health, safety and welfare of the Indian people, we do hereby establish and submit the following resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes supports the Tourism protects and initiatives of Alaska Natives, American Indians and Native Hawaiians, which create economic development and employment across Indian Country while preserving and highlighting our cultures, languages, and traditional life ways; and

WHEREAS, organizations such as the American Indian Alaska Native Tourism Association (AIANTA) 501 (c)(3) national nonprofit association of Alaska Natives, American Indians and Native Hawaiians, tribal businesses and individuals are advocating Indian Country tourism.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Seventy-Ninth Tribal Assembly of Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska delegation convened in Juneau, Alaska on April 9-12, 2014, hereby supports and pursues funding authorized by Congress to create permanent funding mechanisms for tourism development and technical assistance in the advancement of economic

development and cultural heritage for Alaska Natives, American Indians and Native Hawaiians and for the tribes that engage in the tourism development and marketing; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall be the policy of the Central Council of Tlingit and Haida Indians.
