SECOND CHANCE REENTRY PROGRAM

What is the Second Chance Reentry Program?

Central Council of the Tlingit and Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska's Second Chance Reentry Program (SCRCP) will provide individuals, while still incarcerated and/or released on probation, with distance training and employment assistance in an effort to reduce the high rate of recidivism in Southeast Alaska. These funds will be applied to existing education and training programs currently offered by Central Council's Vocational Training and Resource Center.

Clients will have access to a structured learning environment to complete a vocational and/or accredited certification program that will result in an apprenticeship, internship and/or employment. The program also provides resource referral, advocacy, and coordinates with other community agencies to ensure that participants are accessing needed services and also fulfilling their unique probationary and treatment responsibilities.

"This new program will provide a crucial safety net of services and support to ensure individuals have the tools necessary to successfully reenter their communities."

Program Eligibility

- Program is open to recently-released Native **and** non-Native offenders seeking training, education, employment assistance or community resources.
 - Sex offenders are not eligible for the program
- There is a program cap of \$1,500 per client; supplementary funds may be obtained through outside grant assistance or collaboration with partner services.
- Potential participants are encouraged to apply if interested. Applicants not eligible for program services will be put in touch with other resources.



Program facilities include a staffed computer lab with internet and printing capabilities.

Getting Started

1. Complete an application and email it to rdybdahl@ccthita-nnsn.gov or deliver to the SCRCP office (forms are available from many community agencies, at www.ccthita-nnsn.gov or by request).
2. Once application has been reviewed, an appointment will be scheduled with a case manager who will establish a service plan based on individual needs.
3. All clients desiring educational training will complete Career Ready 101 and the COP3 (career assessment). A training path will be mutually decided through educational counseling. A study schedule will be established and students will begin courses in the computer lab where tutoring and educational assistance will be provided.
4. As educational courses are being completed, the program staff will provide employment assistance and advocacy for the participant. Staff will continue to provide support and guidance to participants in maintaining their employment obligations and life skills support.
5. Participants can continue to utilize program resources as needs change.
